START A COMPREHENSIVE SAFETY EDUCATION PROGRAM

Comprehensive programs must have the right content, include hands-on training, be tailored to all audiences, and be delivered effectively.

- Safety instruction must be accurate and time-tested. For example, teach children the correct way to cross a street.
- Most people learn best by doing, so include on-the-street exercises for children and parents.
- Children, parents, drivers, law enforcement and local officials all participate in safety education. Help them each learn their role.
- There are many ways to get the word out about safety. Find the right mix for your community, especially if you can partner with other organizations.
