GA SRTS Partnership Levels

Partnering with the Georgia SRTS Resource Center is a great way to start and maintain a SRTS program at your school. Sign-up and receive customized assistance, incentive items and recognition as your program grows. As a School Partner, you will be recognized for achieving Bronze, Silver, or Gold level based on your efforts each school year.

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School Partner All schools are a Resource Center Partner upon signing up. Partner Schools agree to complete the following three activities:

- ✓ Officially partner with the Resource Center by completing and submitting a Partner Profile Form.
- ✓ Identify a school champion to implement programs and to act as a primary contact.
- ✓ Work towards building and maintaining SRTS programs.

Bronze Level are schools focused on making their SRTS program part of the school community achieve the Bronze level. Bronze level schools have completed the activity checked below, plus one additional activity listed.

- ✓ Conduct a Student Travel Survey (at least once per year, preferably at the same time each school year).
- » Host a Safe Routes to School Kick-Off Event (i.e., International Walk to School Day in October or Georgia Walk to School Day in March).
- » Communicate with school parents, teachers and administrators about SRTS (i.e., distribute Way To Tip Sheets (See <http://www.saferoutesga.org/Resources/TipsTools>).
- » Coordinate a Georgia SRTS presentation to school stakeholders (the Resource Center can provide the speaker).

Bronze level Partners receive free incentive items for participation (as needed), and program assistance.

Silver Level are schools that are gaining momentum with their SRTS program. Silver Partners have completed all Bronze Partner requirements, plus the checked item below and at least one additional program.

- ✓ Support two SRTS Events each school year, such as
 - A neighborhood walk/bike ride to assess safety issues and the ease of walking/bicycling to school along key routes
 - Fall and spring walk and bike to school days
 - A walking and biking safety assembly
- » Sustain at least one on-going program to encourage walking and biking, such as walking school buses or bike train.
- » Conduct a classroom-based program on safe walking and bicycling behaviors.

Silver Partners receive an event banner, free incentive items for participation (as needed), and program assistance.

Gold Level are schools that are striving for long term sustainability. Schools at this level all Bronze and Silver Partner requirements, plus the checked item below and at least one additional program.

- ✓ SRTS Program is supported by the PTA or in some other way to ensure program participation each successive school year.
- » On-going classroom-based pedestrian and/or bicycle education for all students.
- » SRTS Program is integrated into the school's reward system, or other on-going school program.
- » Teachers and staff actively participate in the SRTS program.

Gold Partners receive a free incentive items for participation (as needed), an item for a SRTS contest prize, and program assistance. The Georgia SRTS Resource Center strongly encourages Gold Partners to develop a School Travel Plan.
